Welcome

The aim of our research is to meet the needs of communities, population groups, service providers and to advance academic scholarship. The 2022 annual report highlights some of our excellent and transformative health promotion research that meet these needs. We strive to work collaboratively and across disciplines, sectors and countries, with the overarching aim of impacting health promotion research, practice and policy. With this in mind we have worked tirelessly to build on our Knowledge Translation skills and activities.

Our annual event in 2022 was our Health Promotion Conference that was held on campus on 16th June. It was great to be back in-person to meet with all our colleagues and to network to build new collaborations. The theme of the event was 'Health Inequity: Action for change', which was attended by 193 delegates and was chaired by Drs Margaret Hodgins and Lisa Pursell. This event was hosted in collaboration with the Health Service Executive, Department of Health, Association for Health Promotion Ireland and the Institute of Public Health. We have a conference web channel that hosts the keynote presentations and other sessions held throughout the day.

Our 'Population Health' seminar series also proved a great success in 2022. We deliver these seminars in collaboration with our colleagues across the University including the Health Behaviour Change Research Group, the HRB Primary Care Clinical Trials Network Ireland and the PPI Ignite team. We continue to host these seminars online and recordings are available on the seminar series channel.

In 2022 we secured re-designation as a **World Health Organization (WHO) Collaborating Centre for Health Promotion Research**. Over the next four years we will continue to work in supporting the WHO work programme at WHO Headquarters in Geneva and at the WHO Regional Office for Europe.

In 2022 we also hosted lots of undergraduate and graduate students and academics from around the globe. All placements and visitors were based physically in our research centre, which brought a sense of purpose and excitement back to the workplace. We look forward to welcoming many more visitors in 2023 and beyond.

Our incredible staff work tireless to deliver on research projects that impact policy and practice and I would like to acknowledge and thank each and every one for their contribution. A special note of thanks to Dr Viv Batt, our Administrative Director who deserves recognition for the quality of her work, her commitment to the centre and her ongoing support in 2022.

The core focus of our work plan is on the development of health promotion capacity through the translation of health promotion research into policy and practice.
