The doubling of the Global Burden of Disease due to mental and substance use disorders in the past 25 years (1990-2015)





Figure 2: The rising burden of mental and substance use disorders, Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, and suicide (self-harm) by SDI groups

Data are **global burden of disease health data**. SDI is a summary measure of a geography's sociodemographic development and is based on average income per person, educational attainment, and total fertility rate. SDI=sociodemographic index. DALY=disability-adjusted life year.




In the US (and other HIC), >50% of the total burden of disease, in young people


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
The Mental State of the World in 2023

Since 2021, the average MHQ, as well as the percentage of respondents who are Distressed or Struggling, has shown little change, regardless of whether we look across these 8 original English-speaking countries, the 32 countries tracked since 2021, or the 64 tracked since last year.






